

L.A. Religion and Labor Council Opposes 'Right-to-Work' Measure

The Religion and Labor Council of Los Angeles, representing religious leaders of the three major faiths, today announced its unqualified opposition to Proposition No. 13, the so-called "right-to-work" measure on the November ballot.

The Rev. George Lyon Pratt, pastor of the Episcopal Church of the Advent and president of the council, in announcing the group's opposition to Proposition 13, pointed out that the council was established to consider moral and ethical issues of common interest to religion and labor. The council, he said, recently made a study of so-called "right-to-work" legislation.
