Torrance-Goes-To-Church Month Begins November 1

Torrance-Goes-To-Church will be the theme of a month-long endeavor by the Torrance Minister's Assn. to acquaint newcomers to this city with the houses of worship available locally. It was announced today by Father Hugh Percy of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, president of the ministerial group.

Laying the ground-work for Torrance-Goes-To-Church Month, which will get under way Saturday, Nov. 1, will be the preparation of a flier by the minister's association which will list the various churches and their locations. Young people affiliated with churches of this city will distribute the fliers door-to-door next week to every family in Torrance.

"IN THE LAST FOUR YEARS..."

Father Percy stated, "The Chamber of Commerce reports that this city has grown by 22,000 persons. In the process of establishing homes, setting up routines of work and family life, many families have not become acquainted with the spiritual opportunities which the House of Worship makes possible."

"Some folks have no church home and are uncertain just where to go. Others have a denominational or emotional tie with their former community," the minister added, in indicating that the purpose of the flier was to assist these families in locating the church of their choice or the church of their neighborhood.

"This challenge is also for the children of Torrance who make up over 40 per cent of the population," Father Percy explained. "The churches and church schools will be looking for that face which enters as a

stranger, but leaves welcomed to return again."
