Big-Time Sports Car Racing Attracts Riviera Housewife

When Ruth Doushness, a comely, brown-eyed lassie with a spray of golden freckles across her nose, talks of racing her motor, she's speaking automatically, not idiomatically.

For Mrs. Doushness, as she's more formally listed on the personnel rolls at the Torrance Works of United States Steel's Columbia-Geneva Steel Division, spends a lot of her off-work leisure hours racing sports cars in top-flight California competition.

And what's more, she's got some 17 trophies at home, 160 Paseo de la Concha, Hollywood Riviera, to prove she can wheel with the best of them in the greening, vibrant sport now sweeping America.

IF IT'S ANY consolation to male motorists who contend women's place is at the Bendix and not behind the wheel of a Mercedes-Benz, Ruth's husband, Bill, who sells sports cars in Los Angeles, taught her to drive.

"That was in 1949, before we were married," she hastened to explain when advised it is a matter of record that few husbands have successfully taught their wives to drive.

Shortly after moving to California in 1954 from their native New Jersey, Ruth and Bill took up sports car racing. She entered her first competition at Palm Springs in April, 1955, driving an MG TF-1500.

"BILL TOLD ME to get out and keep out of the way," she recalled. "He instructed me to just get the feel of the course — to come in last. So, I fooled him and came in next-to-last."

The following September she finished third in a race at the Santa Barbara road races.

"I got off to a good start and was leading around the first three turns." Though some of the bigger cars passed her shortly thereafter, she was still well up front going into the last turn of the first lap.

Tough as it is, racing speedy European-made sports cars takes a back seat to driving Detroit-built autos in the Mobilgas Economy Run, in Ruth's estimation.

"This is the hardest driving I've ever done," she admitted in commenting on this spring's General Petroleum-sponsored event in which she was one of seven women entered.

"IT WAS DIFFICULT for me, because I had to switch from being a lead-footed sports car driver to a feather-footed gas-economy-minded one. The officials had set this year's average speed at 45 m.p.h. and we had to do our best to keep the car moving at the designated speed under all driving conditions."

Ruth placed fourth in her class in the miles per gallon competition in the Economy Run.

Men, particularly those who hold the only safe way to enter a supermarket parking lot during peak women's shopping hours is to park a block away and grab a cab, may take a dim view of this, but Ruth thinks women are better drivers.

"AS A RULE, women tend to be more careful than men," she explained, "and their greater concern for themselves, their passengers and others on the road makes them safer — and, better — drivers."

She believes that most bad driving habits are unintentional, that they are caused by the driver thinking of other things.

"You've got to keep your mind, as well as your eyes, on the road," she said. "In street driving as well as racing, you've got to anticipate — to think ahead."

In her off-driving moments she, like other sports car racing buffs hereabouts, is looking ahead to the big races at Pomona on Nov. 22-23.

"I'll be in it," she emphasized, "if Bill approves."

THOUGH ROAD RACING

builds up more tension in most drivers, Ruth finds the gymkhana the most physically exerting type of competition. She described the latter as a sort of wheeled slalom in which drivers race their motors against time around a tortuous course outlined by rubber pylons which taxes the skill of the most expert pilots.

"This is the most trying competition because you're continually turning and straightening out and downshifting," she explained.

Ruth described downshifting as a sports car racing trick which enables the driver to come out of turns faster. This is done by toe-heeling—holding the toe on the brake and the heel of the same foot on the accelerator.

Ridgeway to Link Alondra Park To Parking Lot

Plans and specifications for construction of a pedestrian bridge across Dominguez channel to link the picnic area of Alondra park to the El Camino College parking lot were approved this week by the Board of Supervisors and a call for bids issued, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn reports.

Bids on the project will be returnable on Nov. 19.
