# Drivers Reminded To Renew Licenses

Renew your driver's license up to six months before it expires, and "lose no time or money."

This suggestion was made today by Paul Mason, state director of Motor Vehicles, to a million of California's over seven million motorists whose driver licenses are due to expire in the next six months through April, 1959.

The 1957 improvements in the driver licensing laws now make it possible for a motorist to apply for renewal of his license as much as six months before it expires, Mason explained. "This does not cancel out any of the valid period of the old license. Thus, the full value of the \$3.00 fee required in law is received. And the licensee who renews early can avoid getting a short-term license that must be issued if he applies more than 30 days after the expiration date."

New classrooms will include special rooms for journalism, home-making, business, general science, and handicapped youngsters.
