Ballet Performance To Aid Dental Work

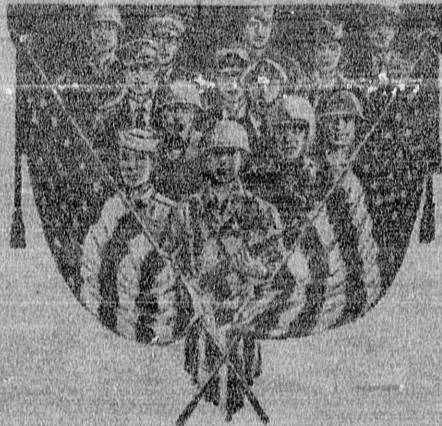
The talented feet of one group also provides annual creek-ups of children's teeth with local dentists donating their time.

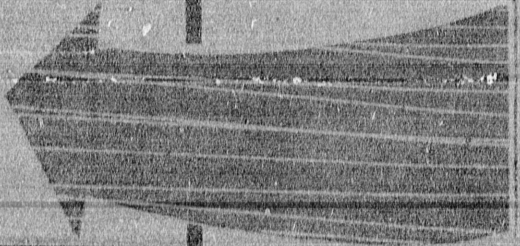
