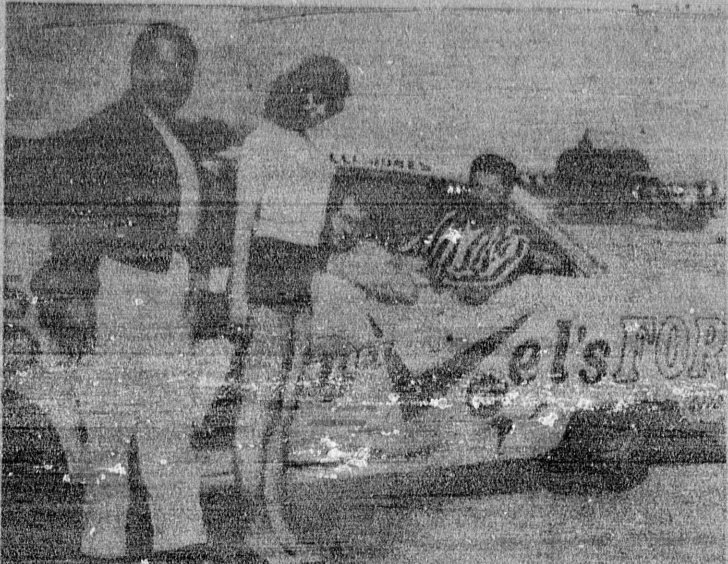

## No. High Saxons Meet Hawthorne North Torrance In Homecoming Football Classic Little League Officers Named

The North squad will be favored to win the tilt and thus improve on their 2-1 league record.

The Cougars have posted four championship seasons since their entry into the Pioneer circuit in 1951, but they are under the scoreboard this season with a 1-2 record. Hal Chauncey is in his eighth season at Hawthorne and has again developed a fine Cougar squad. The Cougars suffered a 13-7 loss to a surprising Culver City team in an afternoon tilt on the Culver gridiron in last week's round.

## Montgomery High Wins Fourth Football Engagement of Season

In their fourth win of the season the Knights of Bishop Montgomery high school defeated the Vikings of St. Bernard, 12 to 6. The game was played Saturday at Montgomery Field.

After a scoreless first quarter, the Vikings, late in the second quarter, marched 75 yards in 5 plays. The key play was a 63 yard sweep by Mike Gallagher, who also dashed the final 6 yards for the touchdown.

The tailback of the Vikings was thrown back to the 10 yard line in attempting the extra point. Half-time score was 6-0 in favor of St. Bernard.

Early in the 3rd quarter on a last down, Joe Rutherford burst 47 yards over right tackle to pay dirt. Rutherford's try for point was low. The Knights then pushed inside the Viking 20 yard stripe but were unable to score.

Then, in the final three minutes the Vikings started to march, but Montgomery's Larry Monaghan, playing corner backer, turned the tables on the Vikings when he intercepted a pass on his own 12 yard line and ran it back 88 yards for a touchdown. Joe Rutherford warded off a potential tackler to spring Monaghan over the goal line. The try for point after touchdown was wide to the left.
