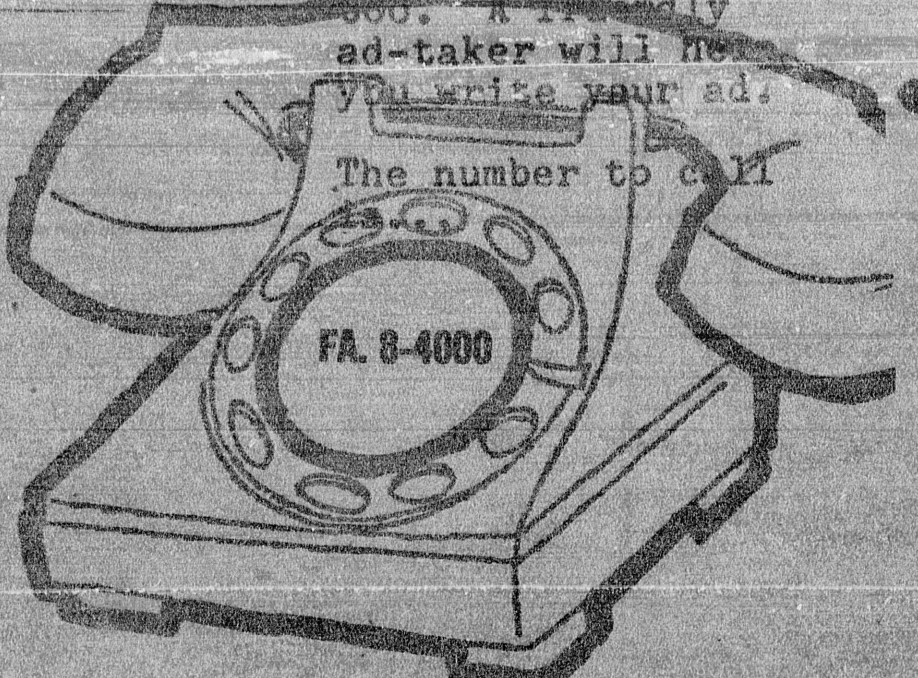
Garden Club Bazaar Set For Tuesday
