Testimonial for John Anson Ford To Be Held at Palladium Dec. 1

John Anson Ford, for nearly a quarter of a century a member of the County Board of Supervisors, will be honored at a testimonial dinner Dec. 1 at the Hollywood Palladium.

Arrangements for the tribute to the veteran public official are being made by a county-wide committee headed by George H. Case of Palms Verdes, president of the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, and A. E. England, past president of the Hollywood Chamber of Commerce.

Under the law, Ford was barred because of age from seeking re-election again this year to the office he has held uninterruptedly since 1934.

Born in Waukegan, Ill., in 1883, Ford came to Los Angeles in 1920 and founded a public relations firm. He was chairman of the Grand Jury in 1928. He won reelection five times to the Third District seat on the board; on two of these occasions he was unopposed.
