

Narbonne Water Co. Hearing Slated in Lomita on Dec. 16

The California Public Utilities Commission announced this week it has set Dec. 16 for further hearing in Lomita on an old rate case involving the Narbonne Ranch Water Co. No. 2 in which the company was required to make substantial improvements in its system to provide adequate service.

The hearing will be before Examiner Grant Spylers at 10 a. m. in the American Legion

Hall, 24702 Narbonne Ave. IN DECEMBER, 1953, the Commission authorized the company to increase its rates but at the same time ordered the improvements after several customers complained of the service, particularly low water pressure throughout the system.

In the order reopening the case, the Commission said the company "may not have made the improvements" required

by the previous decision. The purpose of the further hearing is to determine whether the decision should be "altered or amended in any respect or whether additional orders" should be made, the Commission said.

The company, which recently has been the target of additional complaints involving low pressure, serves about 1100 customers in the Lomita and Torrance areas.

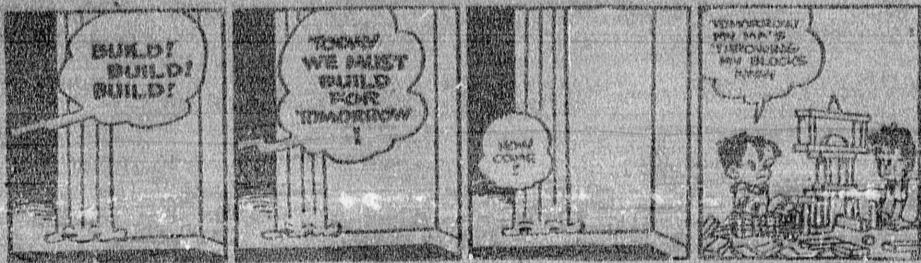



He recently recorded several compositions by Chopin for a new recording company.
