Phone Projects Told by Vaupel

Several outside plant projects aimed at improving facilities in the Redondo exchange were revealed today by H. C. Vaupel, General Telephone manager for the Frontier number area.

Already under way in the vicinity of Calle Mayor east of Highway 101 and south of Soledad are cable rearrangement projects aimed at providing expanded facilities for the commercial and residential development in that area. These projects are expected to be completed by March 15, 1959, Vaupel reported.

Also in the Palms Verdes area, and scheduled to start Dec. 1 and complete by March 15, is a cable splicing project intended to permit upgrading of services in the area east of the Palms Verdes central office building.

"Two more projects, which will provide relief in the Redondo area, are set to begin the first of the year," Vaupel continued. "The first one will add facilities in the district south of Torrance Boulevard east and west of Highway 101." The other project is con-

nected with the city improvement of 190th Street east of Flagler Street.

"All the projects mentioned are to be completed by the end of March, 1959," Vaupel stated.

 ORDINANCE NO. 1029
 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AMENDING APPENDIX I OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, 1957, RELATIVE TO THE PLANNING DEPARTMENT'S PLANNING COMMISSION CASE NO. 580.

WHEREAS, the City Council does hereby amend the said Ordinance in that it is to be the public interest that certain changes be made in certain real property in the City of Torrance as described in Section 2, as amended, in Planning Commission Case No. 580; and

WHEREAS, the said real property is located in the vicinity thereof and the public interest is hereby protected by the proposed change of zone from the Planning Commission and that hearings on the application have been held as herein provided;

SECTION 1.
 That the City Council of the City of Torrance does hereby find and determine that the change of zone from the Planning Commission Case No. 580 as more particularly described in Section 2 hereof is necessary for the preservation and enjoyment of substantial public utility in the vicinity thereof, and that the change of zone will not be materially detrimental to the public interest in the vicinity thereof, and that the proposed change of zone from the Planning Commission and that hearings on the application have been held as herein provided.

SECTION 2.
 That said change of zone from the Planning Commission Case No. 580 as more particularly described in Section 1 hereof is hereby approved, and the said Land Use Map of the City of Torrance is hereby amended to show such reclassification and zoning; and that the portion of said map as amended and hereby approved is hereby attached as a part of the said Land Use Map of the City of Torrance and is hereby substituted for the portion of said map as previously substituted for the said Land Use Map of the City of Torrance.

SECTION 3.
 That all real property to be reclassified as herein provided is hereby reclassified as follows:

ALL that certain real property situated in the City of Torrance, County of Los Angeles, State of California, described as follows: Southeast quarter of Lot 22, Block 10, Torrance Tract (4 acres) located West of Normandie and South of Loma, in the City of Torrance, County of Los Angeles, California.

SECTION 4.
 That said ordinance substituted in Section 2 and the map to which it is attached and hereby approved and adopted, is hereby approved and adopted, and the portion of said map as amended and hereby approved is hereby attached as a part of the said Land Use Map of the City of Torrance and is hereby substituted for the portion of said map as previously substituted for the said Land Use Map of the City of Torrance.

SECTION 5.
 That all Ordinances of the City of Torrance, inconsistent herewith in the extent of such inconsistency and no further, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6.
 This Ordinance shall take effect thirty days after the date of its adoption, and prior to the expiration of thirty days after the date of its adoption shall be published at least once in the Torrance Herald, a semi-weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in the City of Torrance.

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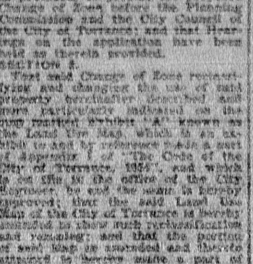
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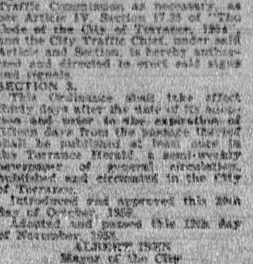
