Certain seasons of the year stand for certain foods and the recipe contributed in today's column is a "just right" for these cool, nippy days.

Mrs. George Stephens, 5016 Ruby St., Torrance is today's guest cook. With a husband and two growing boys in her family, she finds the "chili" meal is a favorite.

Mr. and Mrs. Stephens are natives of Montpelier, Ida. They lived in Colver City for four years before moving to Torrance two and a half years ago.

HOMEMADE CHILI

- 1 lb. red beans
1 lb. ground beef
2 medium onions
1 clove garlic
1 can tomato paste
4 cups tomato juice
1 tbsp chili powder
1/2 tsp cayenne pepper
salt
black pepper

Soak beans overnight, drain, cover with cold water, boil. Break up ground beef into small pieces, add onion, garlic small amount, cooking oil and brown.

Add meat to beans, then tomato paste and tomato juice. Also chili powder, cayenne pepper, salt and pepper (amount of these seasonings may vary according to different persons' tastes).

Simmer about four hours until beans are tender and juice has thickened slightly. Serve with breadsticks, crackers, tossed salad and dessert.
