### Chest Volunteer Partially-Built Luncheon Set Hospital Slates Open House

A tremendous effort is being made to keep the Harbor Area in the lead for the Los Angeles report meeting of the Community Chest Campaign scheduled to take place Friday, December 12, at the Statler Hotel, according to Glenn Koger, Harbor Area chairman. Koger said that while Harbor is leading other associated cities groups with over 80% of its \$107,100 goal collected, they are still \$21,000 short of finishing the job.

Torrance, the city with the highest goal in Harbor Area, has reported exactly 80 per cent, which is the same as the average for the entire area. "The women in the residential division of the campaign have demonstrated the money can be collected in a fast campaign," said Jim Becker, Chest city chairman, in announcing that this week the Torrance residential campaign had pulled into second place with 77 per cent of their goal.

Other totals to date in the Torrance campaign are as follows: commerce and industry, 75 per cent of their goal collected to date; advance gifts, 70 per cent; and business, 43 per cent. "With Christmas so near," Becker added, "it is essential that every volunteer chest worker should finish his assignment this week. There is no reason why the Harbor Area should not be way out in front at the Statler luncheon next week if the men volunteers in Torrance will just finish their job this week."
