Adult Education Program Launched by PTA Council

Torrance Council of Parent and Teachers Associations, 33rd District CCPT having as one of its objects—to promote understanding of the purposes and functions of the schools—has launched a council-wide project in a program called "Looking In On Your Schools."

Topics suggested included instructional materials and resources, library services, school plan and facilities, school board and its responsibilities, financing of the schools, curriculum, guidance, and counseling services.

The scope of the study in a particular PTA group will be determined by the cooperative planning of the PTA and school officials.

Dr. Hull and Dr. Albert Foster, superintendent of instruction, organized a plan to provide resource people from the district office to be available to these parent discussion groups.

The Torrance Council PTA, realizing the hysteria and fear of survival from the firing of the first Sputnik by Russia by the general public has passed, decided the climate is favorable to try to help each and every person to be better informed about the public school system.

There are twenty-six Parent Teacher Associations in the council and twenty-two units are sponsoring parent study discussion groups with the remaining ones in the process of organizing.

The three high schools in Torrance have featured in their PTA meetings some important phase of parent education in regard to presenting some aspect of the public school functions.
