Projects Rushed On Ski Runs and Lifts at Baldy

Work is being rushed to complete two major construction projects at Baldy. General Manager Herb Leites reported.

The prime task involves the construction of ski runs and installation of rope tows in the new beginner and intermediate skiing areas that was carved from a mountain. The projected cost of which is estimated at \$300,000. Heavily moved an entire mountain.

American Legion Honors Gridder

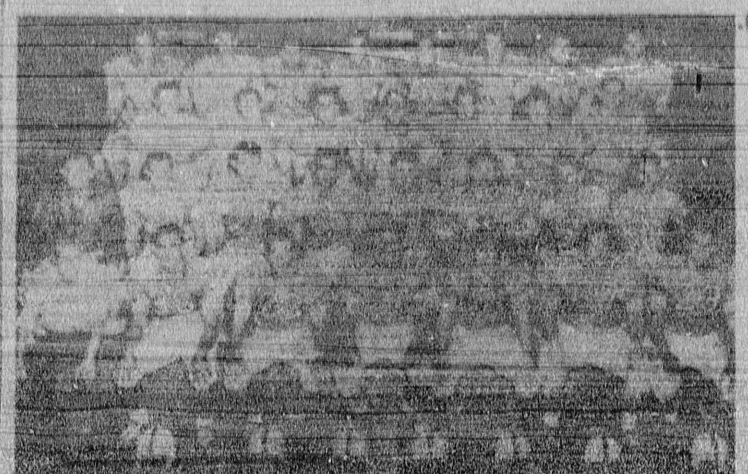

Following the close of the North high school varsity football season when the Saxons dropped at 13-19 last-minute heartbreaker to Long Beach Poly, the Torrance HERALD's sports staff named coach Robert F. "Bob" Shoup, Torrance high school football "Coach of the Year".

The selection was based on development of player ability, coach-teams spirit and press relationship.

Coach Bob Shoup brought his Saxons through the 1958 league games and the Northside eleven wound up in a three-way tie with El Segundo.

Lady Luck entered the picture when the Saxons eliminated the other two schools.
