YMCA to Continue Program Despite Reduced Budget

The Torrance YMCA reminded all citizens and friends today that our local "Y" is operating a full program despite reduced funds. The board of managers of the YMCA met last evening to consider the financial emergency faced by the local youth group.

The board voted to continue the full program of the YMCA in confidence that the citizens and friends of Torrance will wish to provide the support needed to serve more than 6000 local youth.

BECAUSE OF RECESSION problems and the reductions of gifts that came from hard-ships, the YMCA will end the year in the red unless a number of citizens and firms find it possible to make gifts at the close of the year.

Mervin H. Schwab, chairman of the finance committee, ex-

pressed the conviction that if citizens knew of the good work of the YMCA, and of the desperate need of the "Y," that many people and companies would wish to send checks to help the YMCA meet expenses.

SCHWAB ASSURED all parents that staff and activities will not be cut until Torrance has had an opportunity to provide the added support necessary to finish the current year's program.

Schwab pointed out that a donation mailed to the Torrance YMCA can be deducted in 1958 tax returns, if it is given before Dec. 31. He requested all people that the YMCA is not a recipient of Chest funds, and complete support must come from generous gifts within our community.

GARDENERS CHECKLIST

1. It's late to start a lawn, but not too late to feed established lawns lightly. They'll store the food and get off to a flying start come spring.
2. You still see color from roses, but many plants are beginning to go dormant. Don't prune until after Christmas though -- especially in milder coastal areas. In other areas, you can wait as late as January or early February.
3. For especially exotic camellia bloom, look to the giant-flowered Reticulate varieties. Nothing in the family can match their ruffled beauty.
4. Cyclamen in pots are still a good bet for color from now into spring. You can set them outside, except in the state's coldest climates.
5. A good mulch applied before winter rains will do wonders toward building humus and restoring worn-out soil. Use all the manure you can afford.
