

AREA COUNCIL TO FETE HALF-MILLIONTH SCOUT

To celebrate registration of the first half-million members of the Los Angeles Area Council, Boy Scouts of America, two weeks of special activities are planned for the half-millionth boy and his unit.

The selected Cub Scout or Explorer will be feted and celebrated at many special events, including a day at Disneyland and Pacific Ocean Park, and at the Hollywood Santa Claus Lane parade Friday, Dec. 19.

In addition the half-millionth member, along with 12 other "district representatives" registered in Scouting between Nov. 15 and Dec. 12, will present Souvenir pins to the Board of Supervisors Tuesday, Dec. 23.

ALTHOUGH the half-millionth boy will be registered between Nov. 15 and Dec. 12, there is no way to determine exactly which boy registered first at the recent half-millionth member of the Los Angeles Area Council.

Every boy registered during that period as a Cub Scout or Explorer will be eligible to be the half-millionth member. Selection will be by chance, with one boy's name from each of the 12 districts drawn. The boy whose name is drawn will become his own district's half-millionth Scout candidate.

A new confectionery and party store in the Riviera area was set up by a local baker when Eugene D. Pinski, 31 North High and Palms Ver-



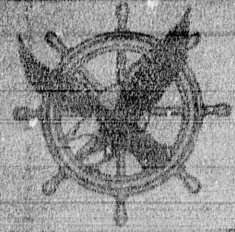

Legionnaires Oppose Tax Changes

Legionnaires representing the 261 posts in Los Angeles County have adopted a resolution opposing any change in the tax exemption privileges currently authorized by constitutional provisions in California.

Legion County Commander Allen Daily said the resolution was the result of observations made by veteran leaders at a recent hearing conducted by a legislative interim committee which indicated that the next

session of the legislature may consider the elimination of such property tax exemptions.

According to Daily, the resolution claims that the "citizens of California have expressed their gratitude to those who have rendered service to their country in time of war," and the exemption provision has enabled veterans to own their own homes.

Copies of the resolution were ordered dispatched to each of the 23 Legion districts in California. Commander John J. Flynn of Vallejo was urged to take all necessary steps within his power to effectuate the intent and purpose of the resolution, Daily added.
