Ieland A. Doan was named general manager of the Dow Chemical Co.'s Western Division to replace him in that post. Retiring also from the directorship of the Dow Board, Curtis will continue in the active service of the company as vice president.

As a member of the Dow sales staff since his graduation from Pomona College in 1911, Doan was transferred to the Los Angeles sales office from the San Francisco office in the role of personnel manager at the Dow-operated government-owned Styrene plant.

Hospital Bid Tops Amount Of Estimate

The low bid received for construction of the new Bay-Hatler Osteopathic Hospital was about \$22,000 higher than the architect's estimate of the project, it was revealed after bids were opened Monday.

Ernest W. Hahn Co. of Inglewood bid \$214,970 to be the lowest of eight bidders. The hospital board of directors has taken his bid under submission.

The 80-bed hospital, designed by Architect Hugh R. Davies of Long Beach, is scheduled to be constructed at Lomita Blvd. and President Ave. in Harbor City.

The board may revise the specifications to make the hospital project fit the money available, may accept the bid, or throw out all bids and re-advertise, a spokesman for the hospital said yesterday. A meeting was scheduled on the matter last night.
