Cecil King Gets Top Plurality In Entire U.S.

Congressman Cecil R. King of the 17th District yesterday was hailed as the Congressman receiving his greatest plurality in the entire United States in the November election.
The veteran legislator who won reelection to his ninth term in the House of Representatives by a margin of 121,217 votes, topped all the rest of the 436 congressmen elected, according to complete semi-official tabulations.
Speaker of the House of Representatives Sam Rayburn, in personally congratulating Congressman King for his record-breaking win, pointed out that his sweeping plurality included out-polling even Congressmen elected at large, who are voted on by their entire State.
Final tabulation in the 17th District, including absentee ballots, shows that Congressman King received 181,270 votes to 59,993 for his opponent, Leonard Dimick.
