BEST BUYS FOR THE WEEK

In Torrance Markets

No dearth of delicious foods in this fair country of ours. Meats and poultry of all kinds will be plentiful during the rest of December... and for the winter holidays. 1959 promises to be a good year for meat.

Have a change of pace. There are lots of turkeys and chickens... switch from one to the other for delightful, economical meals. One is as fast as the other for any occasion.

Because of the demand for hams they'll be a little higher. Remember, that if the pigs have only two hams each... to you will find "specials" on hams.

Some markets may have "specials" but best supplies are still running a little lower than last year... 8 per cent below 1957. Cattle producers are building up their herds. You don't see as much veal for the same reason... 7 per cent less than last year.

For the next few months we will continue to have a plentiful supply of lamb... large lamb, but still yearling. If you will trim off any excess fat you'll find this lamb as sweet and delicious as spring lamb.

Small families can even have legs of lamb. Butchers cut the leg and sell the shank or butt and for a roast.

Or for a money-saving idea, have the butcher cut the leg of lamb with a roast from the butt end, another roast from the shank end, and then two beautiful steaks from the center. Using this method gives you the advantage of the lowest cost per pound.

Egg prices continue to slip. Fresh, large eggs at regular prices are real bargains, but you'll find market "specials" at considerably under 50¢. We won't have to hesitate to stir up egg nog and delicious foods which use lots of eggs.

Most abundant Fresh Fruits and Vegetables. Many of finest quality. Apples, Delicious, Pippin and Home Beauty. Avocados, Cranberries, Grapefruit. Best quality noted in standard white variety from Arizona. Papayas... dropping in wholesale price. Peas, Beautiful Anjou and Nolls. Celery, Cauliflower, Lettuce and Escarole, Sweet Potatoes and Yams, Tomatoes. Lots of these. Some good, but many poor ones. Shop carefully.

Fresh Anise is here in limited amounts. Artichokes, not abundant and high in price. Brussels Sprouts, dry, crisp, bright green, but not in generous shipments.
