Saxon Gridders Not to Receive Jacket Awards

In an effort to clarify the question as to whether lettermen on the North high school varsity football team will receive letterman jackets for winning the 1958 Pioneer League championship the Saxon Varsity Club held a special meeting Monday.

There exists a misunderstanding among some players, parents and fans to the effect that the winning of a league championship entitles lettermen to jackets.

This is contrary to the rules of the California Inter-schools Federation and no high school works their jurisdiction give jackets, according to CIF. In fact the federation has placed a limit of \$10 on any award given by schools to eligible players and in most cases this money is used to buy football medals.

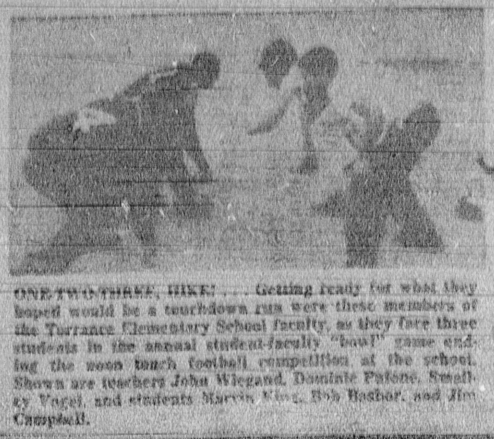
Church Team is Unbeaten
