Schools To Hire Sixty Teachers

Sixty new teachers will be needed to handle the increased number of children in Torrance schools next year, according to a report received by the Board of Education Tuesday.

Preliminary estimates indicate that more than 23,000 children will enroll. To handle this load, an additional 44 elementary and 16 high school teachers will be needed, bringing the total number of teachers in the district to nearly 1,000.
