Casaba Clinics Sponsored Here El Camino Hoopsters Underdogs Meet With Los Angeles Quintet

Casaba clinics for youngsters are planned at three parks during the next two weeks under the auspices of the Torrance Recreation Dept.

Basketball league director Al Pell said the basketball training sessions are slated for Dec. 26 at McMaster Park, Dec. 23 at Sea-Aire Park and Dec. 27 at Walteria Park.

Each class will be from 10 a.m. until 3 p.m.

There is no charge for the clinics, open to all boys of elementary school age, but participants will be expected to wear gym shoes, Pell said.

The instruction is in preparation for youth basketball leagues, which will begin play Jan. 3 at Torrance Park. Youngsters may register at the park nearest their home.

Los Angeles City College will host the El Camino College basketball team at 3 p.m. tomorrow with past records favoring the L.A. City hoopsters.

Since 1947, when the two teams first met on the courts, the Camino cagers have been able to secure only one victory of the 13 games played with the City College.

The "city" team, this year, will have a height advantage over the Warriors, plus the fact that they have won four out of six games played this season.

El Camino's balanced offense and fast break techniques have been proving successful, however, and this style of playing is what may break the string of wins that L.A. City has effected in past competition.

During the first half of the game, the Warrior five managed to stay ahead of the opposition, but in the latter half the College of Sequoias team came to life and displayed fine shootability. Although the Camino cagers fought hard, they couldn't outscore the accurate Sequoias.

Nike Karavas, having scored 16 points in the first half and 12 in the second, was high-point man for the El Camino team.

El Camino College will open its Southern California Junior College Conference wrestling season with Los Angeles City College January 9, in the El Camino College building, scheduled beginning at 7:30 p.m.

Powerful Camp Pendleton Marine Base ripped El Camino 15-14 in one of the most exciting thrill-packed dual wrestling meets Friday on the local mats.

Scoring in the individual matches records three points for a near pin, two points for a take-down and a reverse and one point for a predicament, escape and longest time on the top position.

Team scoring is three points to the team that wins the match by a decision and five points to the team that wins by a pin.

Heavyweight Harold Broughton of Camp Pendleton former Skyline Conference Collegiate Champion from Colorado and runner-up in the X-Merite team tournament, defeated Louis Belger by scoring an escape and longest time on the top position to an escape for Belger.

Date Deliber (135) of El Camino fought his way to two re-

verses and longest time on top position to defeat Larry Vaughn, who was All-Irvine Champion in 1957, 52.

Terry Tyrum (120) of Camp Pendleton, 1957 and 1953 Elevate's Naval District Champion, outpointed Clyde Caruso 7-0 by scoring a near fall, a take-down, an escape and longest time on top position.

Feather John (130) of El Camino tied Bob Bell, third place National AAU Champion, 6-0 by scoring three escapes, one reverse and longest time on top position to three take-downs for Bell.

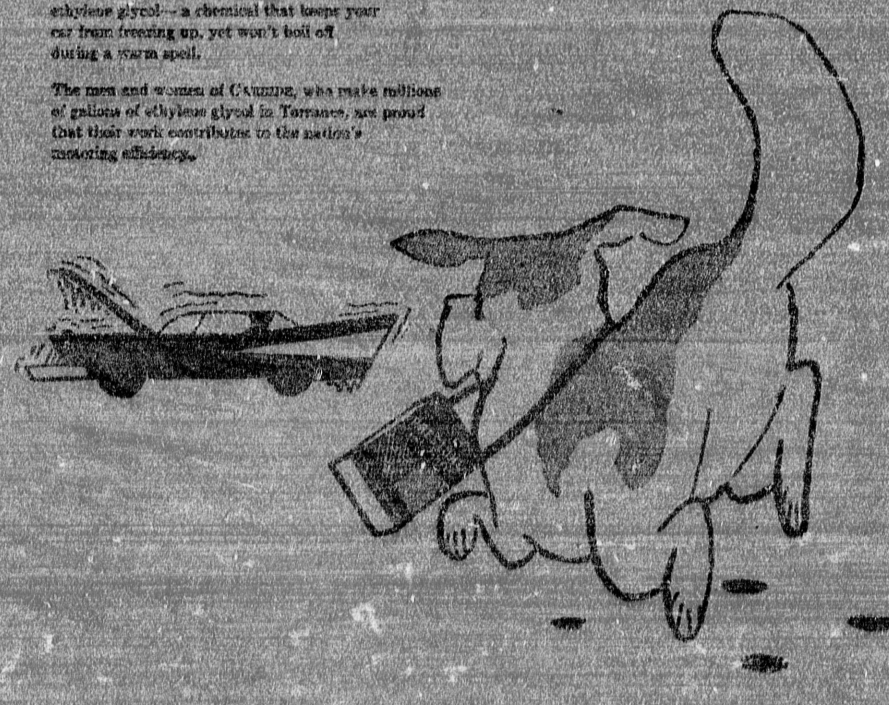
