#### New Torrance Industrial Executive Sees Boom Year

The prediction that the next six months may make 1959 the best post-war year in housing in the nation was made today by a resilient tile flooring ex-

pert.

Joseph L. Kolcyski, vice president of manufacturing for Kentile, Inc., the country's leading producer of resilient tile flooring, said that "private home starts now appear firmly headed for a 1,450,000-unit year." In 1955, home starts totaled a record-breaking 1,328,00.

Kolcyski based kis prediction of a continued housing bom on a recent survey of national economic factors contributing to the upward trend in housing.

Kolcyski, here to break ground and supervise initial construction for a huge Kentile manufacturing plant occupying 250,000 square feet, said that his company decided to build for the first time in California to meet the burgeoning needs of homebuilders in Western states. Kentile maintains plants in Brooklyn, South Plainfield, N. J., and Chicago.
