ELKS PLAN FLAG DAY OBSERVANCE TODAY

A farewell salute to the 48-star Flag will keynote this year's observance of Flag Day today by Torrance Elks Lodge 1948.

Exalted Ruler Marvin Pike invited the public to join with the Elks in tribute to the Flag which has been the symbol of freedom for 47 years.

The addition of a star to Old Glory's Union on July 4, representing the new State of Alaska, will be the first change in the Flag since 1912, when New Mexico and Arizona became the 47th and 48th states. A 50th star, for the State of Hawaii, is soon to be added.

El Camino Graduation Plans Told

Baccalaureate services for more than 400 El Camino College graduating students will take place at 7:30 p.m. Sunday in the Campus Theatre. Dr. Wendell Miller of the Community Church of Manhattan Beach will be speaker.

Traditional graduation brunch will be served Friday, June 19, at 10 a.m. in the Campus Center, with commencement exercises slated to be held at 4 p.m. that afternoon in the college stadium.

Following presentation of candidates by Dr. Stuart E. Marsee, president of the college board of trustees, the associate of arts degree will be conferred by Foster A. Day, C. F. Horne, Rear Admiral, U.S. Navy, retired, and vice-president and division manager of Convair, will deliver the commencement address.

Pike also urged all citizens of Torrance to fly the colors before their homes and places of business today.

THIS YEAR'S Flag Day observance will commemorate the 182nd anniversary of the adoption of the design for the flag by the Continental Congress on June 14, 1777. Congress resolved then "that the flag of the United States be 13 stripes, alternate red and white, and that the union be 13 stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

"As we raise the Flag on June 14, let us remember that it was the proud successor to that first Flag under which our gallant forefathers fought and won for us our independence," Pike said.

"Let us remember the brave men who fought under our Flag of 48 stars at Chateau Thierry, Omaha Beach and Pork Chop Hill to preserve our heritage of freedom. As we welcome the new stars to Old Glory's firmament, let us resolve to remain faithful to the traditions and principles symbolized by those stars and stripes."

EXALTED Ruler Pike said Chuck Marquand, Loyal Knight of the lodge, is chairman of a committee to plan the Lodge's Flag Day observance.

The Flag Day program will be held in the Lodge quarters, 1953 Carson Street, at 3 p.m. The public is invited to attend this program and join the local Elks as they pay tribute to the Flag.
