Garden Checklist

By California Association of Nurserymen


- 1. When glads are six inches high, spray to control thrips. Repeated sprayings at two or three-week intervals provide insurance against infestation. See your local C.A.N. nurseryman for the right spray.
- 2. Mulch around Camellias, Rhododendrons, Azaleas and Fuchsias to conserve moisture in the soil. A good layer of peat or planting mix does the trick.
- 3. For a longer vegetable harvest, make new sowings of Carrots, Radishes, Beets, Squash, Cucumbers and Beans. Parsley can still be sown also.
- 4. Bearded Iris can be divided after bloom—now or later. If you haven't divided them in three years, they probably need it.
- Keep after roses. A feeding is in order this month. Continued deep irrigation is always the rule. And keep spraying if aphis or other pests show up.


