## **Union Carbide Employees Get** Savings Checks



I RECENTLY received a request for an opinion regarding the practice of hiring aged persons to manage apartments. The following is an Opinion which I received from the Office of Legislative Coursel re

a letter from one of you constituents in which h states that apartment hous owners have engaged in the practice of hiring aged persons to manage their estallishments at very low saries plus a small aparment. His main objectic appears to be that such corpensation is inadequate for the services rendered.

"You ask whether there anything that can be do to correct the problem in the services of the services rendered.

"You ask whether there anything that can be do to correct the problem in the services of the state of the laws of this State do not contain any provision prescribing a minimum wage for general application to all private employment. Section 1182 of the Labor Code provides only that the Industrial Welfare Commission may fix '... A minimum wage to be paid to women and minors engaged in any occupation, trade, or industry in this State, which shall not be less than a wage adequate to supply the necessary costs of proper living to, and maintain the health and welfare of such women and minors. The wage so fixed is the legal minimum wage for such women and minors, and the payment of a smaller wage is unlawful (Lab. C., Sec 1197).
