

An additional \$80,000 also should be forthcoming as the result of the legislature's adoption of Gov. Brown's budget, Superintendent J. H. Hull reported. However, school officials are waiting to get final assessed valuation figures, particularly on the contested inventories and utilities.

Action on a salary increase probably cannot be taken befor the figures are in next month, Hull said. If assessed valuation figures are as high as expected, prospects for a two per cent raise are good, he said. School districts throughout the area generally have been raising teachers salaries.
