## Dead Dog Decays

 As Pound Delays who lost his life beneath the porch of a house in east

Final chapter in the life of the unidentified pooch began Wednesday of last week at the home of 72 -yearbegan Wednesday of last week at the home of 72 -year-
old Mrs. Nancy Kenny, 21226 S. Main St., when the animal squeezed under the porch to get out of the heat of the noon-day sun
crawl space the dog was unable to get out of the narrow crawl space, Mrs. Kenny called the Los Angees County
Pound later that afternoon. The pound refused to send help.

THREE DAYS later when the elder Mrs. Kenny left home to spend the week end visiting her daughter-in aw, Mrs. Jean Kenny at 18612 Mettler Ave., Gardena porch. Thinking that the dog had managed to scratch his way out somehow, both women disregarded the warning smell and left.
When they returned Sunday night neighbors told them that the body of the dead animal had created a nuisance in their absence, attracting maggots and per-
meating the neighborhood with its offensive stench. meating the neighborhood with its offensive stench.

On Monday the younger Mrs. Kenny finally suc ceeded in getting a man out from the pound, only to be told when he surveyed the scene that he could not neighbor child removed the dead body of the dog, and then to take it with him. The driver of the pound truck took off, saying that after the body had been removed and placed it in front of the house, it would be picked up-sometime Monday afternoon.

MOMENTS LATER, covered with long socks over his tiny hands little seven-year-old Joseph Biers slithered under the porch and removed the dog's decayed body. The two Mrs. Kenneys placed ot, wrapped-o
keep from attracting flies and maggots-on the front kurb. By Tuesday morning the pound had not yet arrived.
