

An Aug. 4 public hearing is slated on the Torrance Unified School District's \$10,545,000 publication budget, following its approval by the Board of Education Tuesday.

By the time the hearing is held, the figures will be revised slightly, reflecting revised assessed valuation figures and complete compilation of 1958-59 costs. The previous budget figures were based, in part, upon estimates.

Unofficial assessed valuation figures for the district show that local taxable property is valued at about \$192,650,000, an increase of about \$13,300,000 over last year. While this will mean additional isome for the district, the schools will have 2000 more pupils, seven new plants and a number of additions, more teachers, and higher costs than they had last year.
