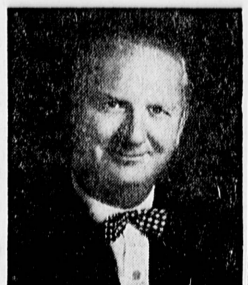
Chamber to Hear Coin Collector

Gardena Group Launches Drive For Auditorium, Civic Center

A group of business and professional men have plunged into a \$500,000 to \$1 million project to build an auditorium and community center in Gardena.

Their organization, the Gardena International Center Association, is pitching its first fund-raising event around a testimonial dinner for Assemblyman Clayton Dills, who is serving his 18th year as 87th district representative.

Dinner, to be followed by a musical comedy revue, will be held Aug. 22 at 6:30 p.m. at Serra High School, 14830 Van Ness Ave., Gardena.

IDEA FOR an auditorium-community center was drawn up by 12 men in the Gardena area, who felt the much-needed facility could be built most efficiently by a nonprofit, non-political, nonsectarian corporation, which they formed officially last June.

While a preliminary rough sketch of the center will be rendered in the near future, the GICA has agreed to wait until substantial funds are collected before seeking a site for the building.

BASICALLY, the group plans a 1000-seat auditorium; a convention floor that will double as a gymnasium, to hold about 3000 persons; various-sized meeting rooms for service and other club functions; a swimming pool, and kitchen facilities.

Fund raising will be a year-around effort with a special annual booster like the scheduled testimonial dinner and comedy revue.

Entitled "There Oughta Be a Law," the show is comprised of skits which will feature such masters of whimsey as Ethel Shutta, associated with the famous W. C. Fields until his death in 1946; pantomime artist Arthur Walsh; and David Lipp, waggish Hollywood night club master of ceremonies.

NUCLEUS of the GICA is a five-man board of trustees, headed by R. Mark Ferris, Gardena newspaper executive who is also president of the organization. Other trustees are Gardena city councilman L. Pete Jensen and three Gardena businessmen, Ken Nakaoka, Arnold Kazan and Wayne Nelson.

Besides Ferris, officers are King Barton, state Democratic committeeman, vice-president; Brother Joseph Hoffman, Serra High School principal, secretary; and Charles Nader, Gardena retailer, treasurer.

THE FOLLOWING are additional charter members of the organization: Robert Wenzel and William Reus, executives in the Gardena branch of California Bank; Taul Watanabe, Gardena planning commission chairman and local investment banker; and Don Mario, advertising account executive.

G. R. Younkin, assistant manager of the Gardena branch of Bank of America, is an associate member.

Heading the membership committee will be M. F. B. MacBan of Metropolitan Savings, while Frances Maschio of First Federal Savings will head the publicity committee.

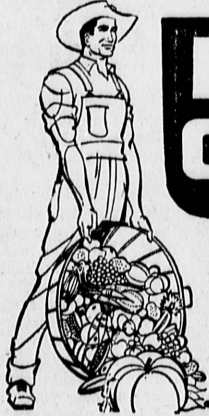
