Campaign for Free

Our long campaign to put dividing barriers on some of the more hazardous sections of Los Angeles freeways appears at last to be bearing fruit.

The State Division of High-ways has just now called for bids on construction of such protective barriers on 14.1 miles of the Hollywood and Santa Ana freeways in and south of Los Angeles.

My own part in this campaign began with my first session in the Legislature in 1955, when I attempted to get legislative support for the construc-tion of dividing barriers.

AGAIN IN the 1957 session I introduced legislation to the same effect, but again it was held up in the Senate Trans-portation Committee owing to the opposition of the Highway Division.

The best I was able to ob

tain was a concurrent resolu-tion directing the Highway Di-vision to consider the feasibil-Summer Youth Reyival Set

THE SENATE bill was lost in the Senate Transportation Committee, while the Assembly version, in a watered down form to make it permissive rather than mandatory, was finally passed by both houses and sent to the Governor.

Thereafter it was vetoed on June 18, I believe on the grounds that the problem was a technical one and should be resolved by specialists in the department rather than by the
