### School Registration Under Way; 25,000 Expected for Fall Term

More than 25,000 students are expected to answer the call to return to school when classes in the Torrance Unified School District start again on Thursday, Sept. 10.

This will represent an increase of more than 2000 students over the opening enrollment last fall. Some 20,000 elementary, and 5000 high school students are expected in local classrooms, with a teaching staff of about 950.

Registration of new students currently is under way at North, South and Torrance High Schools from 1 to 3 p.m. daily through Wednesday, Sept. 2. Returning students registered last spring.

Strikes have delayed construction work on additions to North and South Highs and Edison, Waveria, Steele, and Madrona Elementary Schools. Some NHS and SHS classrooms may be ready by the opening of school, but some temporary use of rooms not usually used for classes may be necessary, according to Assistant Superintendent S. E. Waldrip.

HE ESTIMATED that the additions would be ready within 60 days and "probably much sooner." Construction jobs are being speeded as much as possible, he said.

PARENTS OF elementary students may register their youngsters at their neighborhood school. Persons in doubt about the school may call the district offices, FA 8-8060.

Students will report to classes on Sept. 10, although orientation sessions will be held for high school freshmen the previous day. Bus schedules will be announced shortly.

Completion of seven new school plants last year will drop double session figures considerably from last year's opening figure of 4530. Opening double session figures will be about 3300, but these will drop with completion of the additions at Edison, Waveria, Steele, and Madrona in the fall and additions at Anza, Arlington, Newton, Lincoln, and Sepulveda later in the school year.

Fern-Greenwood students are on double session, because of earthquake-proofing of the Fern building, a job which should be completed early in 1960. Also slated for opening early next year is Adams Elementary School, 238th and Arlington, which will relieve double sessions at Wood School.

QUESTION MARKS in the attendance picture are large new tracts of homes being built in the Victor Tract and scheduled at the corner of Sepulveda and Crenshaw.

Classes will be in session for 176 days, ending next June 10. Holidays are scheduled for Veterans' Day, Nov. 11; Thanksgiving, Nov. 26 and 27; Christmas-New years, Dec. 23-Jan. 1; Lincoln's Birthday, Feb. 12; Washington's Birthday, Feb. 22; Easter, April 11-15; and Memorial Day, May 30.

Schools which will have new principals this fall include Casimir, Martin Beaudet; Hillside, John W. Strom; Newton, C. Richard Wallner; Perry, Robert D. Allen; Seaside, William Zecher; Waveria, Victor Kilburn; and Wood, Donald Mulaney.

Up Muir Trail

Twenty-four young hikers from our area are now hiking along the thirty-three mile section of the John Muir Trail from Devil's Postpile to McGee Creek. The total John Muir Trail is 210 miles from Yosemite to Mt. Whitney. This trip, although a rugged one, has been awaited with eager anticipation by adults and youths from the age of fourteen and over.

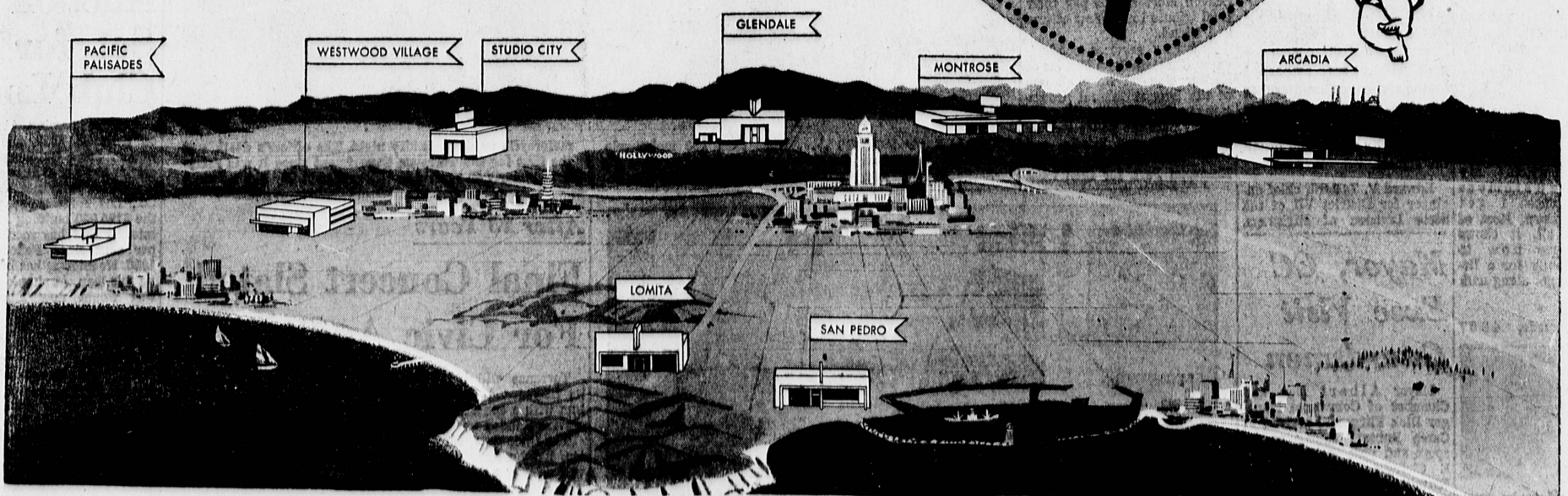
