The second annual Torrance Airport Day at Municipal Airport Saturday will be spotlighted by comely Kathy Marlowe, Hollywood movie star, who will attempt to learn to solo a plane that day at the airport on Pacific Coast Hwy, between Hawthorne and Crenshaw.

The blonde star, who never has flown before, will start receiving flying instructions at 9:30 a.m. when Airport Day officially gets under way. Before the event's close at 5 p.m., Miss Marlowe will try to solo. Instructions and planes will be furnished by Skyline Co., a local concern at the airport.

The gala event is sponsored by the Airport Com-mission, the Torrance Chamber of Commerce, and the City of Torrance. General Chairman Joe Doss of the Chamber's Aviation Committee said Miss Marlowe's attempt to solo had been added to the day's activities to dramatize the ease in which one may become a pilot today and to arouse public awareness in the future of aviation, especially at Municipal Airport here.

Day. One of the worlds' largest aircraft, a Douglas C-133A, will be named the "City of Torrance" at the festivities. Torrance's first lady, Mrs. Albert Isen, will christen the great turbo-prop heavy cargo transport at 1 p.m. Doss recently reported that only one other city-San Francisco-had been honored in this manner, adding that arrangements have been made for the public to go aboard the sky monster to view first-hand the new craft.

The C-133 has the ability to haul a 41,700-pound payload, can fly 3500 nautical miles-or a 95,000-pound load for distances up to 1500 miles. Ninety-six per cent of all ground force military vehicles can be hauled fully assembled by the great ship. First flight of the craft was in April, 1956. It is 157 feet 6 inches long and has a wing span of 179 feet 8 inches and a height of 48 feet-plus a few more inches.


