A construction feature of the new store is that all of its four sides are to be given a thorough-going architectural treatment. This is permitted through an ingenious arrangement by which sides in the following the state of t ment by which all incoming and outgoing trucking is to be handled via a large ramp lead-ing directly to the basement level.

A WIDE STRUCTURAL canopy with embedded spot lights provides shade and weather protection as it juts out horizontally from the building's face and runs continuously along the south side and partially along the east and west clevations of the store, covering the raised pedestrian walk which encircles the building and leads to each of the 12 main entrances. main entrances.

Nearly 200,000 man hours of work in 27 different trades have gone into the tremendous Sears store construction job, in which 36 different sub-con-tractors were utilized.

AMONG THE interior features are the complete elimination of conventional display windows, a store communicative system for carrying announcements and music throughout the building, and a conveyor-equipped receiving and marking room which will keep merchandise on wheels and rollers from the time it is moved from deep inside the delivery trucks until it reaches a final resting place on the stock shelves.

Completely air-conditioned

completely air-conditioned by a plant of 572 tons of re-frigeration capacity, the store will be supplied with 326,000 cubic feet of filtered, cooled air per minute.
