

USE OF THE electronic sys-tem was sold to the board on the basis that the device could do the work more effectively and efficiently and that it would save the county money. Supervisor Hahn opposed the contract when he learned that Datamatic had not built

any machines or placed them in operation when the county entered into the contract.
"Yet, with this sad experience behind them, the supervisors voted 3-2 to spend another \$300,000 for an electronic device to even electronic

tronic device to count election ballots," Hahn stated. Supervisor Hahn, supported by Supervisor Ernest E. Debs, sy supervision Effect E. Dess, voted against the increased expenditure, pointing out that the county had already paid out \$600,000 in tax money for the development of the vote counter.

VOTING FOR the additional expenditure were Supervisors Frank G. Bonelli, Burton W. Chace and Warren M. Dorn.

Iin January, 1953, the board entered into a contract with the Norden-Ketay Corp. for the development of an electroic vote counting device. The contract called for the county to pay out \$600,000 for the development of the system and ownership of the system and ownership of the prototype machine.

AT THAT TIME, Hahn vigorously opposed the contract on the following grounds:

1. Norden-Ketay had never built a vote counting device

of the type proposed.

2. The contract called for the county to subsidize the development of the device. which if it proved successful could be sold all over the United States.

3. There was no guarantee that the company could build the device or that it would

4. There are serious questions about whether the sanctity of the ballot would be pre-

HOWEVER, ON the repre-sentation that the electronic device would result in savings

device would result in savings to the taxpayers, the board voted 4-1 to enter the contract, with only Supervisor Hahn in opposition.

Subsequently, Norden-Ketay Corp. was taken over by United Aircraft Corp.

At the budget hearings last June it was learned that United Aircraft required the county to spend another \$300.000 for development of the vote counting device.

THIS WEEK the board voted to approve an amended contract for development of the vote counting device which made the \$300,000 additional available to United Aircraft.

Aircraft.

In opposing the contract, Hahn pointed out that his original objections still remained; that the county had no guarantee that the system would work, that the county was subsidizing the development of a commercial device which could be sold all over the country.
