Deadly Disease Discovered in **Trout Shipment**

Routine inspection of trout importation at California's border has saved the State's freshwater fisheries from a possible disaster of major pro-

possible disaster of major proportions, the Department of Fish and Game has reported. A fungus parasite, Icthyosporidium, known in the east as "herring disease", was mind in a shipment of some 5,000 trout consigned to the Sacramento Valley area. The shipment was turned back at the border. border.

Had the shipment been per mitted into the State, such popular fisheries as salmon striped bass, shad, sturgeon as well as trout, could have been seriously jeopardized.
