Garden Checklist

By California Association of Nurserymen

1. Primula malacoides—the dainty Fairy Primrose —can be set out now for color early in the year. Try an edging of them in a partially shaded bed.

2. Stake and lavel favorite Chrysanthemums so you can divide them next year. Take out varieties you're not wild about and start new ones in spring.

3. Some Azaleas like to rush the season, are showing color already. When transportating them to the garden, you can set them out in pure peat moss. They love it. Be sure to soak the peat overnight before planting.

4. Spring flowering Sweet Peas can be sown now. Dig the trench deep to allow for a good root run and, work plenty of manure in under the seed bed.

5 Check foundatiou plantings for that overgrown look. Don't hesitate to replace an outsize shrub with one that won't crowd its neighbors.
