4 eggs, separated Sift flour, baking powder and salt together. Cream shortening with ½ cup sugar until fluffy. Add well-beaten egg yolks, vanilla, milk and sifted dry ingredients. Spread mixture in two greased pans. Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry. Add remaining sugar gradually and beat until eggs hold a sharp peak. Spread over unbaked mixture in both pans. Sprinkle with almonds, 1 tablespoon sugar and cinnamon and bake in moderate oven (350° F.) about 30 minutes. Cool and spread custard filling between layers.
