TO MEET THIS peak need four underground storage projects have been developed for the Los Angeles area. The storage reservoir at Playa del Rey is owned and operated by the Southern California Gas Co. alone. Located in a depleted oil field, this project covers 200 acres of land and has a capacity of one and one-half billion cubic feet. The reservoir is located at a depth of 6,000 feet below the surface. Giant compressors totaling 6220 horsepower are used to increase the gas pressure to 1500 pounds so that it can be injected thto the reservoir. Over 12½ million has been invested the date in this project.

APPROXIMATELY 75 per cent of the gas supplied to local consumers comes from out-of-state sources. Pipeline deliveries now are nearly six times larger than they were when the first 30-inch pipeline was completed in 1947. During 1957 the Needles-to-Newhall 30-inch line was placed in operation.

Gas for this line is supplied by the El-Paso Natural Gas Company from its Texas fields. 
