What's in a name (change)?

YOU HAVE to notify employees, customers, shareholders, service station dealers,

ers, service station dealers, lessors, lessees, royalty holders, vendors and suppliers, transportation companies, utilities, and hundreds of others.

In the past three months 22 men at General Petroleum have been involved directly in co-ordinating name-change activities. They have been retivities. They have been responsible for mailing more than 1,000,000 notices of the company's intention to change its name.

ECONOMY consistent with good business practices has re-sulted in saving many forms with the General Petroleum

name on them.

For example, almost 1,500, 000 from copies, with a value of more than \$40,000, will be saved from obsolescence. This will be accomplished by the use of some 3000 rubber stamps on 175 different types of forms. The handling and shipping

of the new forms and station-ery will be a gigantic task. For instance, it is estimated that more than 200 tons of paper will be involved in just one part of this operation.

Other details involve the change in title and registration of 1,400 cars, trucks, trailers, tractors and other specialized equipment located in 10 states.

DOOR SIGNS or identification on about 1100 units must be changed; new licenses for brake and lamp testing stations have to be obtained.

Title and registration on airplanes, floating equipment and barges, foghorns and firetrucks will be changed; 50 company microwave and radio stations and 80 mobile (not Mobil) radius will be relieved. dios will be relicensed; new

identification tags must be placed on more than 2000 telegraph poles and 200 valve boxes.
