Collective bargaining is a two-way street

The Company is willing to give you higher wages, better insurance at less cost to you, bigger pensions, more protection for longer service, and continued costof-living protection. That's all "give" on our part.

It's no secret that the steel industry faces strong competition from other materials and from foreignmade steel. At United States Steel we also face competition from other steel companies. All we want is a reasonable chance to compete with these other materials and other steel producers.
