

Time's running out on all current hunting seasons. It will end for quail, chukar, cottontails and brush rabbits 30 minutes after sunset on Friday, Jan. 8, and for waterfowl at sunset the same day. Bear season ends 30 minutes after sun-set Friday, Jan. 8, except in Humbolt County where no closed season prevails.


