## **Exemptions Can Reduce Your Obituaries** Tax Payments, Experts Claim

You can reduce your income tax by taking full advantage of deductions for exemptions which are allow-

ed—

(1) because you are filing a

return,
(2) because you are blind, or
65 or over, or
(3) because you have "dependents."

The forms themselves make easy to claim these deduc-

tions and to compute the proper amounts.
On the federal return, the amounts of deductions are:

\$600 for each taxpayer (per sonal exemption) \$600 additional for each

blind taxpayer \$600 additional for each taxpayer 65 or older at year's

\$600 additional for each de-

☆ ☆ ☆ California income tax rules are the same, except that the are the same, except that the personal exemption is \$1500 instead of \$600. If husband and wife file seperate returns, turns, the total exemption of \$3000 may be divided between them in any way they wish. There is no additional exemption because of age.

The exemption for blindness is not based on total lack of sight but on severe impairment. Your physician can determine whether you will be the comparation of the com qualify for this exemption under the law.

Confusion is sometimes en-countered in determining just who is a qualified dependent under the income tax laws. The primary test is that the "dependent" must receive more than half of his support from you.

There is an exception where several people contribwhere several people contribute to the support yet no one contributes more than half. In such cases, they may enter into a "multiple support agreement" which entitles one of the group to claim the dependency deduction.

There is the further requirement that the percent

quirement that the person supported must be a citizen of the United States or a resident of the United States, Panama, Mexico, Canada or the Canal Zone.

special tax rate schedule

\* \* \* For California purposes, no

special tax rate schedule is used. However, you are permitted to deduct a personal exemption of \$3000—instead of deducting a \$1500 personal exemption for yourself plus \$600 for the dependent that qualifies you for "head of household." In other words, your taxable income would be \$900 less than it would be if you filed as a single person claiming a dependent.

Under a special provision enacted in 1958, a legally adopted child who is neither a citizen or resident of the United States may be a dependent if the child lives with the taxpayer during the entire year.

the taxpayer during the entire year.

Additionally, your dependent may not have taxable gross income of \$600 or more unless it is your child, under 19, or a full time college student. And he may not file a joint return with another. a joint return with another

a joint return with another taxpayer.

If the dependent is not "closely related" to you, he must be a member of your household for the entire year.

"Closely related" means children and their spouses and their dependents, nephews and nieces, parents, step-parents, mothers-in-law and fathers-in-law, uncles and aunts, grandparents, and bro-thers and sisters (including step and in-law).

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
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


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
