Lucky to Build New Market in **Palos Verdes**

Lucky Stores, Inc., has an nounced plans for an ultra-modern, 30,000 square foot supermarket in the new 30-acre Palos Verdes Shopping Center at Hawthorne and Silver Spur Road in Palos Verdes.

The Pacific Coast grocery chain, which currently operates 27 markets in Southern California, has just signed a lease with Jerome Moss, developer of Palos Verdes Peninsula Center. Construction is scheduled to begin this spring with comple-tion by next fall.

The new shopping center will eventually house 60 stores and will serve a primary area of 35,000 population.
