Here in our own county we have already achieved a degree of cooperation between county and city governments considerably in advance of what is normally to be found in other states, and in the

cooperation between adjoin-ing counties.

Where problems transcend county lines, as in the case of public transportation and air pollution, to name two, the state is the natural agency of government to assist and sup-port local efforts, either through enabling legislation or direct participation.

In all cases the object of governmental cooperation is to make it possible for local government to keep abreast of rapid population growth with the services which they
