Garden Checklist

By California Association of Nurserymen

- 1. If you plan to prune an overgrown rhododendrom, the job is best done this month or early next, even though it means lopping off some flower buds.
- 2. Check with your nurseryman about the proper spray for deciduous fruit trees.
- 3. Fuchsias can be pruned after frost danger has passed. Remove potted fuchsias from pots and replace some of the old soil with new.
- 4. Work steer manure into flower beds and around roses if the ground is dry enough to be workable.
- 5. Camellias are fertilized after they bloom, but don't rush it with early blooming varities. Next month

THE ANNUAL 15-day training periods include travel time and whenever possible the units will move to and from the camp sites by military vehicles. An estimated 1500 military vehicles will move the main body of troops.
