To Meet Here Monday

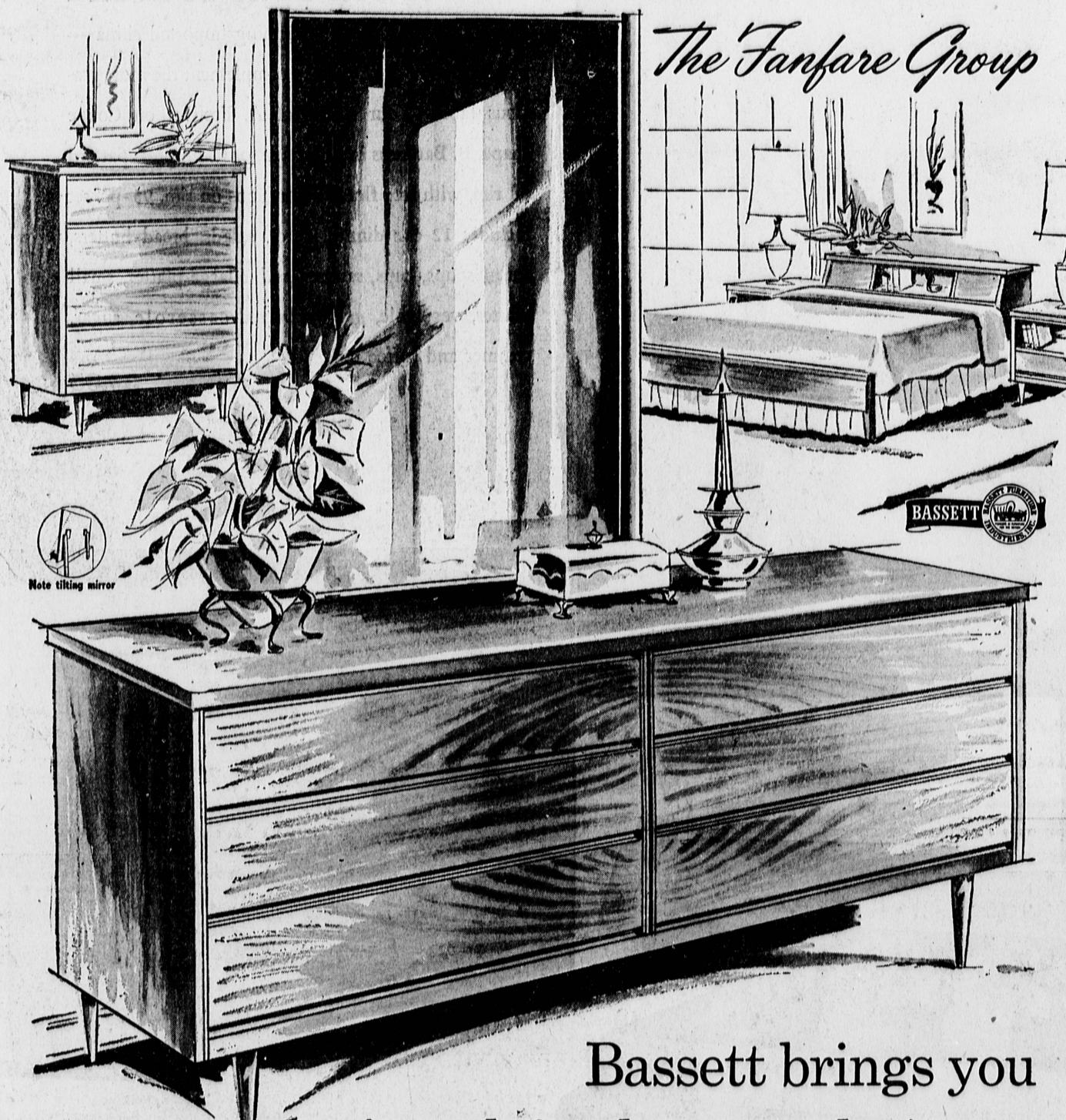
