The reasons for these feel-ings lie in a cage outside the class soons. The class has three chickens, which they call "The Tree Stooges." The birds were raised from eggs by the class. As part of their science projects, the class got a dozen eggs and kept them warm in a home-made apparatus. During the incubation period of 18 to 21 days, the class periodically broke open an egg to see what chick embryos look like in various stages of development. The embryos were preserved in alcohol.
