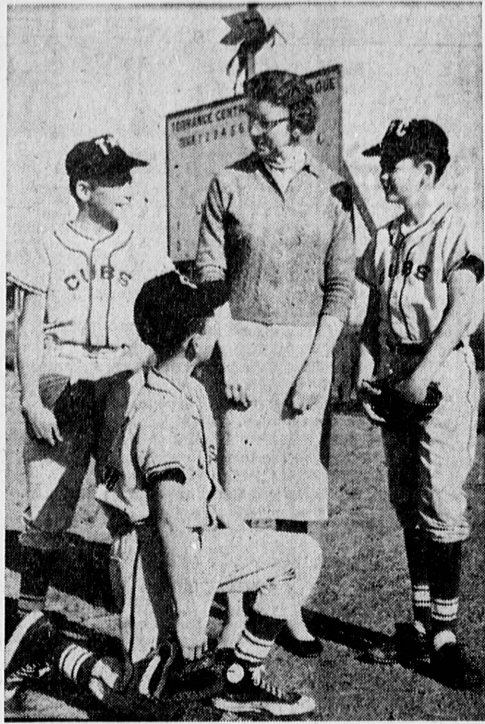
Post time for the first event is 2:30, with qualifying getting underway at 1.

Win'ard, Redondo Harbor Yacht Clubs Combine at King Harbor

Recently merged Win'ard and Redondo Harbor yacht clubs held their first combined meeting Friday night at the Hacienda Hotel in San Pedro.

Dinner was followed by a short business meeting and dance.

The new group, with a name yet to be chosen, will continue to use King Harbor, Redondo Beach, as its home port. Win'ard's clubhouse at the harbor will serve as racing headquarters, a spokesman said.

Six fleets are included in the amalgamated membership of 400 pleasure boatsmen. Win'ard representation is heaviest in the large craft cruising fleet, and in the smaller penguins and Win'ard sabots.

REDONDO brings in its fleets of Lido 14's, satellites, and the tiny seabites. Numerous individual boats also are included in the membership.

Governing the combined group until elections March 18 is an action committee composed of the three flag officers

from each of the old organizations.

REDONDO commodore Tom Freeman and Win'ard commodore Dick Reinhardt issued a joint statement on the reasons for the amalgamation and the aims of the new organization, which draws members from through the South Bay area, Long Beach and southwest Los Angeles.

The two groups had the same objectives of pleasure boating and family recreation, they said, so the members felt they would be better off joining forces. They also will be able to contribute more to future development of King Harbor when acting as a single group, the commodores said.

Both men predicted the merger would make the new organization one of the strongest yachting clubs on the Pacific Coast.

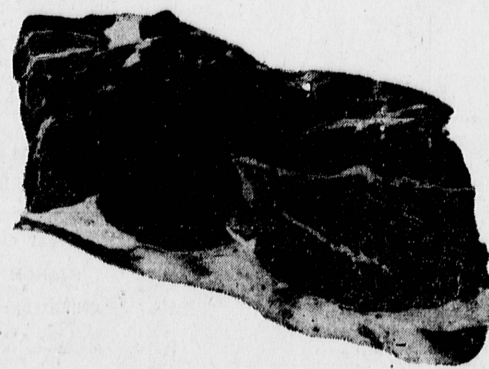
