

## Lowell Napper Promoted With Bethlehem Steel

Lowell A. Napper has been appointed district engineer, Fabricated Steel Construction, for Bethlehem Steel Co., Pacific Coast Division, in the Los Angeles area. The appointment was announced by R. W. Binder, chief engineer for the Pacific Coast Division. In his new assignment, Napper will be responsible for engineering and estimating for fabricated steel construction.

Born Nov. 14, 1927, Napper is a native of Los Angeles. He attended Stanford University, receiving a Bachelor of Science degree in civil engineering in 1948 and a Master's degree in 1949. HE WAS NAMED assistant division superintendent of the sheet and tin mill later that year, superintendent, sheet finishing in 1949, and three years later was promoted to assistant general superintendent of the Pittsburgh plant. In 1954, he was transferred to the division's Torrance Works in Southern California as general superintendent. He returned to Pittsburgh as general superintendent in 1957 and assumed that same position at Geneva Works last March. He is a member of the American Iron and Steel Institute and the Association of Iron and Steel Engineers.

A NATIVE OF New Bethlehem, Pa., Morgan was graduated from the U. S. Naval Academy at Annapolis, Md., in 1933. He served six years on active duty with the U. S. Navy and then started his steel career as an industrial engineer at the Pittsburgh, Calif., plant of the former Columbia Steel Co. He served with the Navy during World War II, was awarded the Silver Star and Legion of Merit Citations, and retired from active Navy duty as a captain, USNR. Morgan rejoined U. S. Steel at Pittsburgh Works as an industrial engineer after the war, worked on special assignments at the plant's new sheet and tin
